

# Help Save the Nēnē

The following guidelines are intended to help you enjoy watching nēnē and other protected Kaua'i species without causing them harm or placing you at risk. Please note these are general suggestions. Follow any posted rules or the instructions of any State or Federal Wildlife personnel.



## Keep them wild

Feeding or watering nēnē can habituate them to people. Fed birds lose their natural foraging instincts and are less likely to survive in the wild. Animals accustomed to humans have a much greater risk of becoming injured.



## Keep them safe

Pets can harm and disturb wildlife. Even the most trained pets can disturb nēnē. Please keep your pets away from these birds.



## Give them space

Attempting to touch, chase or scare nēnē can injure them and you. Harassing nēnē is illegal. Getting too close can disturb nēnē. If the birds move when you move, you are too close.



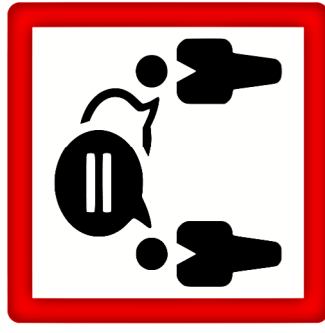
## Pick it up

Nēnē can choke on or get entangled in litter. Please make sure to always properly stow and dispose of your trash. If you see garbage, please pick it up.



## Be Alert

Nēnē love to forage in the short grass alongside roads and trails. When in a car or golf cart, please obey all speed limits and pay extra attention in nēnē zones where collisions may be likely to occur.
